## DESIGN FOR A HANDKERCHIEF.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 18,497, dated July 31, 1888.

Application filed June 29, 1888. Serial No. 278,582. Term of patent  $3\frac{1}{4}$  years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, RUFUS H. ROSE, a citizen of the United States, residing at New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Fabrics for Handkerchiefs, Banners, &c.; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same.

The figure is a view representing my new design as applied to a handkerchief.

A represents the body of the fabric; B, the border; C, a series of stars linked or chained together within and parallel with the border; D, a central figure showing an eagle's nest and an eagle with spread wings protecting her young, and EE panels or blank spaces for suitable inscriptions or legends.

The leading feature of my design consists in

a fabric on whose surface is a white ground, a border of contrasting colors, stars linked or chained together parallel to and within the border, representing the union of States, a centrally-arranged eagle's nest and gray or light-black eagle with wings spread protecting her young, and a series of panels or spaces for legends.

What I claim is—

A design for handkerchiefs, banners, &c., having a border and ground of contrasting colors and an interior line of ornamentation consisting of a chain of stars linked together, as shown and described.
