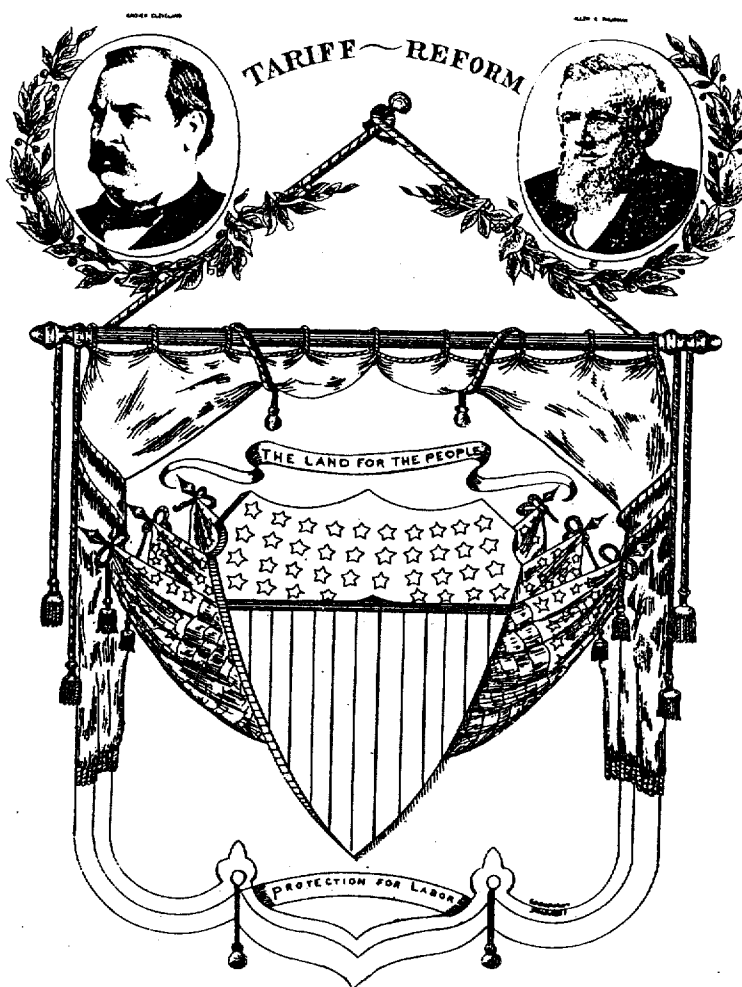

DESIGN FOR A FAN, HANDKERCHIEF, &c.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 18,579, dated August 28, 1888.

Application filed July 25, 1888. Serial No. 281,021. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DANIEL RHODES, a citizen of the United States, residing at Washington, in the District of Columbia, have invented
5 and produced a new and original Design for Fans, Handkerchiefs, &c.; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a
10 part thereof.

My invention relates to a new and useful design for fans, handkerchiefs, banners, and similar articles; and it consists in the arrangement of parts and figures and ornamental grouping
15 on the body of a fan.

The leading features of my invention are the body having thereon the representation of a suspended banner, and two beaded portrait-spaces above each end of the banner, the banner being decorated as hereinafter described.

The banner is substantially rectangular in shape, its lower edge being scalloped, while its upper edge is straight and is attached to a fixture or pole, to which the suspending-cords are
25 represented as being attached. Around the lower edges of the banner is a double-striped border, the inner lower field of the banner being plain. A shield having stars on a colored background at its top and vertically arranged
30 bars below the stars of contrasting colors is represented as being placed on the center of

the banner. A series of flags are represented as protruding out from behind the shield, three on each side thereof, a portion only of the flags showing. Above the shield is a horizontally-arranged scroll. A curved scroll is placed near the bottom of the banner, which extends from one side of the center scallop to the other. On the upper part of the banner, and represented as hanging over the
40 same, are two curtains, their upper ends meeting above the shield, their lower ends and inner sides being drawn back or draped to display the shield and flags. Cords are represented as securing the curtains in place. The
45 portrait spaces or panels above referred to have a spray of laurel-leaves extending around their lower and outer sides. These sprays of leaves are represented as being attached to the suspension-cord.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a fan, handkerchief, &c., substantially as herein shown and described.
