

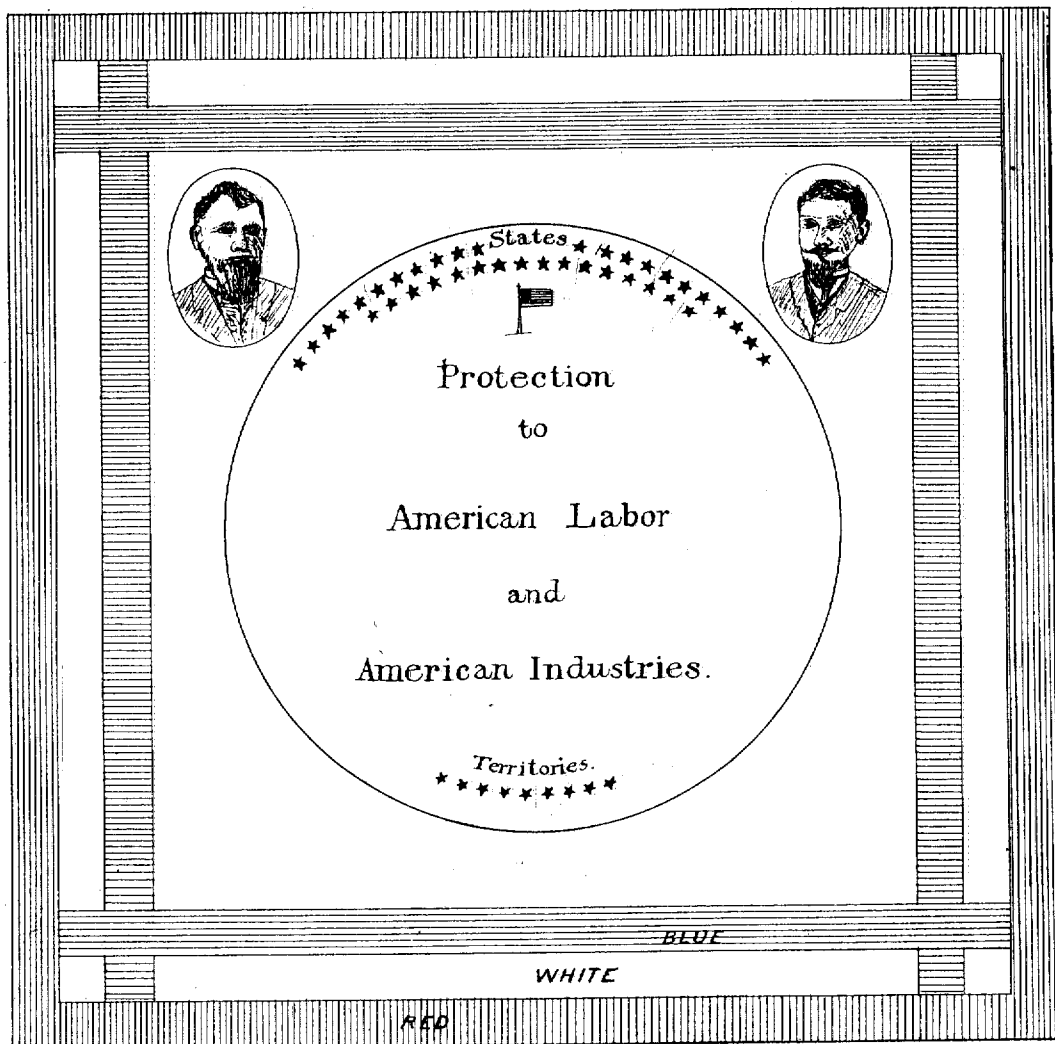

DESIGN FOR A HANDKERCHIEF.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 18,582, dated August 28, 1888.

Application filed June 12, 1888. Serial No. 276,883. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY G. WORTHINGTON, of Washington, in the District of Columbia, have invented a new Design for Handkerchiefs and Banners, of which the following is a specification.

My invention consists of a design for handkerchiefs or banners, as hereinafter described, and as shown in the accompanying drawing.

10 The design consists, first, of a border composed of two parallel stripes with a space between them, as shown on the drawing. Within the space inclosed by the border is a circle, and within this circle I arrange one cluster of thirty-eight stars and another cluster of nine stars, and also the figure or representation of a United States flag, these being so arranged as to leave within the circle sufficient space for suitable words. Within the space between the circle

and the border are two figures or representations of men's heads, arranged to show the face or features of each.

This design may be woven in the fabric or be printed or stamped thereon, as may be found most convenient.

What I claim is—

The herein-described design, consisting of the border, the inclosed circle with the two clusters of stars and the figure of a flag, and the two figures or likenesses of human faces, substantially as shown.
