

DESIGN FOR A FLAG.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,873, dated December 28, 1875; application filed November 27, 1875.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WM. A. DUFF, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated a Design for a Flag, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made, the design consisting of a flag composed of the flags of nations, and which is alike attractive and suggestive of the nations that have announced their intention of taking part, or will take part, in the one-hundredth anniversary of American independence.

It will be seen that the flag of the United States of America is the prominent feature of the design, and it has a border or grouping of the flags of the other nations.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a flag composed, essentially, of the national emblem of the United States of America, surrounded by a border composed of the national flags of England, France, and other nations, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
